The Welcome

Jesus Christ, whom we worship, is our crucified, risen, and ascended Lord and we have been privileged to walk with him through his journey of love.

We have faced the agony of his suffering and death on a cross. We have rejoiced at his bursting free from the bonds of death. We have enjoyed his risen presence with us and his revelation of himself through the breaking of bread. We have seen his return to the throne before which every knee shall bow and every tongue confess that this Jesus is Lord.

And now, with the followers of his own time, we wait the coming of the promised Holy Spirit, his gift to his people, through whom we make Christ known to the world.

First reading

A reading from Book off the Prophet Ezekiel

The hand of the Lord came upon me, and he brought me out by the spirit of the LORD and set me down in the middle of a valley; it was full of bones. He led me all around them; there were very many lying in the valley, and they were very dry. He said to me, 'Mortal, can these bones live?' I answered, 'O Lord God, you know.' Then he said to me, 'Prophesy to these bones and say to them: O dry bones, hear the word of the Lord. Thus says the Lord God to these bones: I will cause breath to enter you, and you shall live. I will lay sinews on you and will cause flesh to come upon you and cover you with skin and put breath in you, and you shall live, and you shall know that I am the Lord.'

So I prophesied as I had been commanded, and as I prophesied, suddenly there was a noise, a rattling, and the bones came together, bone to its bone. I looked, and there were sinews on them, and flesh had come upon them, and skin had covered them, but there was no breath in them. Then he said to me, 'Prophesy to the breath, prophesy, mortal, and say to the breath: Thus says the Lord God: Come from the four winds, O breath, and breathe upon these slain, that they may live.' I prophesied as he commanded me, and the breath came into them, and they lived and stood on their feet, a vast multitude.

Then he said to me, 'Mortal, these bones are the whole house of Israel. They say, "Our bones are dried up, and our hope is lost; we are cut off completely." Therefore prophesy and say to them: Thus says the Lord God: I am going to open your graves and bring you up from your graves, O my people, and I will bring you back to the land of Israel. And you shall know that I am the Lord when I open your graves and bring you up from your graves, O my people. I will put my spirit within you, and you shall live, and I will place you on your own soil; then you shall know that I, the Lord, have spoken and will act, says the Lord.'

Second reading

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

When the day of Pentecost had come, the disciples were all together in one place. Suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the

Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.

Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each. Amazed and astonished, they asked, 'Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language? Parthians, Medes, Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabs—in our own languages we hear them speaking about God's deeds of power.'

All were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, 'What does this mean?' But others sneered and said, 'They are filled with new wine.' But Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed them, 'Men of Judea and all who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and listen to what I say. Indeed, these are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only nine o'clock in the morning. No, this is what was spoken through the prophet Joel: "In the last days it will be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams. Even upon my slaves, both men and women, in those days I will pour out my Spirit; and they shall prophesy. And I will show portents in the heaven above and signs on the earth below, blood, and fire, and smoky mist. The sun shall be turned to darkness and the moon to blood, before the coming of the Lord's great and glorious day. Then everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved".'

Sermon

Good morning brothers and sisters.

Pentecost, what a truly wonderful day! Fifty days have passed since Easter, and we celebrated both the death and Resurrection of our Lord. Pentecost by the way, is the Greek term for 'fifty days'.

In the time since Easter we have seen a change, the days are getting longer, and even a little warmer. Plants are flowering, birds and animals are busy after a long winter. The nature all around us is stirring. God's wonderful creation is coming to

life. But the nature that I want to talk to you about today, though, is human nature. Firstly, the human nature of Christ's disciples. Jesus had ascended to His Father, it was ten days ago that we marked Christ's Ascension into Heaven and Jesus knew that He would need to refocus the minds of His disciples.

You may recall that at the start of our reading from John's Gospel Jesus says 'When the Advocate comes, whom I will send to you from the Father—the Spirit of truth who goes out from the Father—he will testify about me. And you also must testify, for you have been with me from the beginning'. Jesus is telling those first disciples that in His place they now have the Holy Spirit with them to go with them as they begin to spread the good News of Jesus Christ.

The disciples, being human, and having the nature of humans, were inquisitive and questioned Jesus as to where He is going, what was going to happen to Him and to them. Jesus knew that the disciples would not yet be able to fully understand the divine nature of the Holy Spirit so He explains to them, 'I still have many things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now'. Jesus knew that He needed to protect and guide His disciples and for them to understand that the Holy Spirit would take His place here on earth until He returns.

The Holy Spirit was with us before Christ's birth, indeed when Mary asked the Archangel Gabriel how she, as an unmarried woman might conceive of a child was told that this would happen through the power of the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit is here with us now and will remain with us until Our Lord Jesus Christ returns.

Let us now reflect on the earlier scripture we listened to from the book of Acts.

The date of Pentecost coincides with the Jewish Festival of Weeks which was one of three pilgrimage festivals in the Jewish calendar and, for that reason, Jerusalem would have been a bustling place with people from all over the region, assembling to celebrate the festival. A great many would only be able to speak the language of the area that they had travelled from. And it was here that the Holy Spirit first appeared to the disciples.

The way that the Holy Spirit manifested itself to the disciples was not in a calm and gentle manner: it certainly was not like a gentle dove descending to the earth; rather, scripture clearly states that it like the rush of a violent wind that filled the entire house. So the disciples had no doubt as to what was happening to them.

We are told that the sound was so loud that a crowd gathered to see what was making this noise. There's human nature again, somethings happening, and everyone wants to know what is going on. The Holy Spirit wasn't finished yet though, to this crowd the disciples began to spread the news of Gods power and deeds. The disciples, who all came from Galilee and as Galileans would have spoken Aramaic, but the Holy Spirit was giving them the ability to speak to everyone listening in

their own native tongue.

Scripture tells us that **all** the crowd were amazed. But, once again, human nature played it is part, some begun to sneer and said that the disciples were full of new wine, that they were drunk.

St Peter, again obeying his human nature and finding his way as the leader and spokesman for the disciples challenges this accusation of drunkenness by saying that it is only nine o'clock in the morning!

Peter then goes on to quote the prophet Joel. The prophecy he quotes is made by Joel after locusts had devastated Israel. Joel proclaims this as a judgment from the Lord. The sinful human nature, there it is again, human nature, has turned the Israelites from following the Lord and the Lord has punished them. Joel exhorts the people of Israel to repent and return to the Lord, his plea is so impassioned that they do and our Lord forgives them. Not only does our loving God forgive them but He restores their crops and sends Joel a second message. This second message is clear, God will come again, He is coming again in the last days. And in those times, He will pour out His Holy Spirit upon us all. The actual words of Joel's prophesy are 'I will pour out my spirit on all flesh'. Everyone WILL feel the presence of the Lord. Think of the coming presence of the Lord in this way, imagine standing, looking at a beautiful lake in the distance, it's a beautiful site but it's some distance from us. On the day that Joel is talking about, when our Lord comes, we will not be looking at this beautiful lake, we will be immersed in it, we will feel it washing over us.

So brothers and sisters, this Pentecost, let us put aside our human nature, our petty concerns, our complaints, and our weakness's and let us all be immersed in the Holy Spirit of Our Lord. Amen.

Eucharistic Prayer (prayer E)

The Lord be with you

All and also with you.

It is indeed right, our duty and our joy, always and everywhere to give you thanks, holy Father, almighty and eternal God, through Jesus Christ our Lord. For he is our great high priest who has entered once for all into the heavenly sanctuary, evermore to pour upon your Church the grace and comfort of your Holy Spirit. He is the one who has gone before us, who calls us to be united in prayer as were his disciples in the upper room while they awaited his promised gift, the life-giving Spirit of Pentecost. Therefore all creation yearns with eager longing as angels and archangels sing the endless hymn of praise:

Drink this, all of you;

this is my blood of the new covenant,

which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins.

Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

So, Father, we remember all that Jesus did, in him we plead with confidence his sacrifice made once for all upon the cross.

Bringing before you the bread of life and cup of salvation, we proclaim his death and resurrection until he comes in glory.

Great is the mystery of faith:

All Christ has died.
Christ is risen.
Christ will come again.

Lord of all life, help us to work together for that day when your kingdom comes and justice and mercy will be seen in all the earth.

Look with favour on your people, gather us in your loving arms and bring us with all the Spirit-filled saints to feast at your table in heaven.

Through Christ, and with Christ, and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory are yours, O loving Father, for ever and ever.
