First reading

A reading from the Fifth Book of Moses called Deuteronomy

I am the Lord your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery; you shall have no other gods before me. You shall not make for yourself an idol, whether in the form of anything that is in heaven above, or that is on the earth beneath, or that is in the water under the earth. You shall not bow down to them or worship them; for I the Lord your God am a jealous God, punishing children for the iniquity of parents, to the third and fourth generation of those who reject me, but showing steadfast love to the thousandth generation of those who love me and keep my commandments. You shall not make wrongful use of the name of the Lord your God, for the Lord will not acquit anyone who misuses his name. Observe the sabbath day and keep it holy, as the Lord your God commanded

you. Six days you shall labour and do all your work. But the seventh day is a sabbath to the Lord your God; you shall not do any work—you, or your son or your daughter, or your male or female slave, or your ox or your donkey, or any of your livestock, or the resident alien in your towns, so that your male and female slave may rest as well as you. Remember that you were a slave in the land of Egypt, and the Lord your God brought you out from there with a mighty hand and an outstretched arm; therefore, the Lord your God commanded you to keep the sabbath day. Honor your father and your mother, as the Lord your God commanded you, so that your days may be long and that it may go well with you in the land that the Lord your God is giving you. You shall not murder. Neither shall you commit adultery. Neither shall you steal. Neither shall you bear false witness against your neighbour. Neither shall you covet your neighbour's wife. Neither shall you desire your neighbour's house, or field, or male or female slave, or ox, or donkey, or anything that belongs to your neighbour.

Second reading

A reading from St Paul's Second Letter to the Corinthians

We do not proclaim ourselves; we proclaim Jesus Christ as Lord and ourselves as your slaves for Jesus' sake. For it is the God who said, 'Let light shine out of darkness,' who has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ. But we have this treasure in clay jars, so that it may be made clear that this extraordinary power belongs to God and does not come from us.

Gospel reading

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark All Glory to you O Lord.

One sabbath, [Jesus] was going through the grainfields; and as they made their way his disciples began to pluck heads of grain. The Pharisees said to him, 'Look, why are they doing what is not lawful on the sabbath?' And he said to them, 'Have you never read what David did when he and his companions were hungry and in need of food? He entered the house of God, when Abiathar was high priest, and ate the bread of the Presence, which it is not lawful for any but the priests to eat, and he gave some to his companions.' Then he said to them, 'The sabbath was made for humankind, and not humankind for the sabbath; so the Son of Man is lord even of the sabbath.'

Again he entered the synagogue, and a man was there who had a withered hand. They watched him to see whether he would cure him on the sabbath, so that they might accuse him. And he said to the man who had the withered hand, 'Come forward.' Then he said to them, 'Is it lawful to do good or to do harm on the sabbath, to save life or to kill?' But they were silent. He looked around at them with anger; he was grieved at their hardness of heart and said to the man, 'Stretch out your hand.' He stretched it out, and his hand was restored. The Pharisees went out and immediately conspired with the Herodians against him, how to destroy him.



Sermon

Today we are looking at the Trinity in a different way. For those present at the service, I will be showing a so-called Möebius strip—a remarkable thing seen in applications that use belts to drive machinery where, because of its properties, it wears evenly. You can make one easily—take a strip of paper and join it end to end but with a half twist (side A connected to side B of the other end):

The Trinity is a difficult idea to discuss. I've had people scoff to me about how nonsensical it is and how ridiculous an idea it is that something can be one yet three



at the same time. Traditional explanations of the Trinity include the Sun (a physical object yet it also affects us from what proceeds from it—light and heat—so three in one) or water (it exists in three remarkably different forms—the fluid we'd describe as water, the ice (solid) and steam (gas) while remaining always the same chemical formula H_20). Today we look at something different—a remarkable object that is available at your seats a Möebius strip.

To the scriptures:

God is One: Deuteronomy 6:4

This is a remarkable and wonderful passage declaring the absolute difference of the God of Israel and the whole focus of Old Testament worship. God is One. What is interesting about our Moebius strip is that even if we cut it in half down the middle it remains one, unlike an ordinary ring that of course becomes two. One sided and indivisible—cool isn't it?

There's something more about God

In Genesis 1, we see two hints to greater complexity about the nature of God. In the creation story we see God speaking and the Spirit of God moving upon the waters. Nothing conclusive but the hint is there.

And then, in the making of man, God says 'let us make man in our own image'—could quite acceptably be a royal 'we' in the sense of the apocryphal Queen Victoria quote 'we are not amused' but again there is the suggestion of more to be discovered, more to be revealed.

Jesus and his claims

I have had people say to me that Jesus never said he was God—this is rubbish. In John's gospel, Jesus makes explicit claims that are fully understood by his hearers (their response to the perceived challenge to the oneness of God is cry blasphemy and try to stone him!). Let's hear his words: 'Before Abraham was, I am' with its echo to the name of God given to Moses; 'I and the Father are one'; and after the resurrection he accepts worship from Thomas who sees him and proclaims 'my Lord and my God'.

Back to our Möebius strip: if we now cut it around the strip, starting three quarters in all the way round, then take the wider remaining bit and cut again three quarters of the way around that we are left with our strip divided into three but they are all inseparable, intertwined, still one—three in one and one in three. Not a perfect picture of the Trinity but it does show that we can find in creation something that is those things—it not such an outlandish idea after all.
