

Sermon

We are what we eat. Talking of eating, a cannibal went away on holiday and, a week later, came back limping horribly. He had gone 'self-catering'.

We are what we eat. That truth is obvious in a physical way because the correlation between diet and health has been proven beyond reasonable doubt—the very first medical textbook from the time of the Ancient Romans, Galen, starts by saying improving our diet will improve our health. It's also been proven in the areas of mental and psychological health: show a person scenes of gentle tranquillity and the peace rubs off; show a child scenes of violence and they mimic. And it is also proven beyond reasonable doubt concerning our spiritual health.

So, what is the diet I have been feeding the Churches since I joined you here in east Oldham, all those years ago in October 2009? Perhaps, as a priest, I should rephrase that as, 'What is the diet God has been feeding me that I've been sharing?' By the way, talking of food, How fast is milk? It's pasteurised before you know it.

There are many definitions of a priest. My favourite comes from the mighty William Temple: a priest places God before the people and the people before God. I have therefore prayed and prayed and prayed until my spiritual voice is a husky whisper. I have prayed for all of you; and I have spent my voice placing God before you—all of you, repeatedly. Since I arrived, I have preached many thousands of times; I've e-mailed many of those sermons as transcripts. The core message is that you are what you eat.

And you *are* what you eat. By the way, did you hear about the man who drank a large bottle of food colouring and, every time he ate anything, dyed a little inside.

You are what you eat. By the way, much of our fast food today comes from Macdonald's: did you know the chief executive of Macdonald's farm is its C E C E O. The correct spiritual diet of a Christian involves God. As Jesus said in today's Gospel passage, 'Whoever comes to me will never be hungry'. Scripture says repeatedly that God is love so a diet of God is a diet that always involves love. That's why the core message I've been given for us to consume is that God is love, and that He expresses his love and has shared His love. He loves you and me, and He will never ever give up on us, because love is like that and God is like that. Our task is to respond to that love and submit to his loving, just, and gentle rule.

This love comes from God and this love *is* God, but what does it look like? By the way, as a vegan cook, I wonder if I've just made a big, missed, steak. We must love God. Since October 2009, in addition to preaching, I have conducted baptisms—hundreds of them. A baptism is the ceremony or service, a holy rite by which a person starts their journey of faith. It's a kickstart, a formal asking of God the Holy Spirit into the soul of a much-loved child of God. It's also a sign of commitment and

family. All genuine Christian ministry seeks to bring people to faith: it's the gentle desire to bring souls into relationship with God. It's therefore a response of love to love, love reciprocating love. Baptism is therefore asking divine love into a soul. The love of God does that.

You are what you eat. By the way, I once tried to shallow fry a tree branch but it kept slipping out—the pan was non-stick. Since joining you, I have also conducted many weddings. At heart, a wedding is both a symbol of love but also a commitment to join two different houses. It's therefore entirely appropriate for me to talk about weddings, for everything I've tried to do here feeds into the idea of God *being* love and I've spoken repeatedly about joining earth with Heaven. All Christian ministry should propel earth toward Heaven through prayer and sacrament. To that end, it involves the deliberate transformation into Christlikeness, which means living the lives of holiness that God desires. The love of God requires nothing less. So we become like that which we eat.

You are what you eat. By the way, I've been messing with my wife's collection of herbs and spices: she hasn't noticed yet but her thyme is cumin. Since I joined you, I have conducted many hundred funerals. Every funeral should be a service of comfort and is intended to bring hope and consolation. Indeed, all Christian ministry should bring comfort because God does that. That's why ministry involves preparing for Heaven, coaching human souls for eternity spent with God who loves us beyond words. You are what you eat and that eating takes eternity into ourselves.

You are what you eat. By the way, I had a meal made from a cow with two legs—it was lean beef; and the last time I had a meal made from a cow with no legs resulted in ground beef. I've said a lot but it all comes down to the same thing. We are here for God. We must ask God into lives, invite the overlap of earth and Heaven, and in that way prepare our souls to live with God forever. To that explicit end we consuming spiritual love as the nourishment that every Christian soul needs.

You are what you eat. By the way, I've started telling everyone about the benefits of eating dried grapes: it's all about raisin awareness. The God of love has so arranged the world that Christian growth requires growth in love, hence the commandment with which we started this service, to love God and neighbour. Think of Jesus' 'New Commandment' to love as he loves us. Remember that Jesus said you can identify Christians by the way they love each other. You are what you eat: that's why cannibals don't eat clowns—they taste funny. We are what we eat, so listen to Jesus: 'I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never be hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty.' And if we do, 'This is indeed the will of my Father, that all who see the Son and believe in him may have eternal life'.
